Between God and Man: Meaning and Essence in Nigerian Traditional Festivals / Frank Aig-Imoukhuede Lagos: Glendora Books, 2014 376p. 97897899435944 \$ 200.00/ HB 2136gm.

This is a companion book to 'A Calendar of Nigerian Traditional Festivals' by the same author and presents in a clearly defined way, the layering upon layering of cultures which make up the Nigerian amalgram.

It presents a compelling reconstruction of Ife-Benin and Igbo-Ife relationships that accords with existing documentary and archaeological evidence; and an account of the antecedents of Benin, Ife and Igbo Ukwu art, the abrupt end of Ife's classical art and Ife's relocation to its present site. The book explains the seeming incongruities and contradictions in the Moremi-Igbo encounters at lle Ife and the geographical and social distances which make them implausible unless the Ife and the Igbo were neighbours and the encounters between them took place in a different location of Ife.

As proof, the book presents the existence of Igbo ichi marks on soapstone carvings at Esie in Igbomina territory west of the Niger from which the Igbo launched guerilla attacks against Moremi's Ife; and the ichi mark on the soapstone representation at the Ideta shrine in Ile Ife of Obatala, the Yoruba creator god who in the Yoruba Ifa divination corpus, is described as 'Oosa Igbo (the deity of the Igbo.)

'Between God and Man...' is designed to promote heritage awareness for transforming the diversity and pluralism for which Nigeria is known into building blocks for community cohesion and an investment capital for its economic development.

It seeks to promote an integrated approach to the preservation and conservation of the cultural and natural heritage in Nigeria, reconcile the imperatives and requirements of development, strengthen endogenous capacities and the participation of local communities, local authorities and the private sector in tourism development in Nigeria.

Though the study does not cover the whole country, nevertheless, the part which it covers constitutes about two-thirds of the total land area and over half of the country's population at the time of flag independence in 1960. In this book we argue that the intrusion, invasion and subordination of the region's economy by European trading companies destroyed the once self-sufficient and integrated industrial raw material and Agricultural sectors of the economy. The region thus became a mere supplier of basic industrial raw materials to British Industries, and a buyer of their manufactured goods. In the process, its productive classes largely peasants and pockets of metal workers, were impoverished and virtually reduced to penury. The aristocracy lost its sovereignty to the agents interests, and thereby became subordinated to the agents of those companies which in turn, used them in the super-exploitation of the region's resources. The book demonstrates that by the mid-twentieth century, a classical colonial system was effectively established in the region, thereby making the rest of the period that of an intensification of exploitation of both human and material resources.

However, after about sixteen years in power, the military eventually handed over the reins of power to a civilian government on May 29, 1999; signalling the beginning of the nation's Fourth Republic. In this vein, May 29, 2019, marked exactly 20 years since Nigeria, as a nation, returned to democratic rule.

The last military regime, headed by General Abdusalami Abubakar was relatively fruitful; it has so far produced over 20 years of uninterrupted democratic governance with the country witnessing six succeeding civilian governments, elected in nationwide general elections. This had been with the consequent change of power from one civilian administration to another, and more remarkably, from a ruling party to an opposition party in 2015. This is unprecedented.

Meanwhile, military rule and civilian government are two different ballgames. In most cases, succession in military rule is through bloodshed, violence, forceful takeover; and enmeshed in abysmal controversy. The incumbent government is often overthrown through brutal coup d'état. Thus, military rule is notorious for its violent and aggressive nature. On the other hand, civilian rule is designed, all things being equal, for stable and regulated tenure as well as peaceful transition from one administration to another.
