The third section on Security Challenges and the Strategic Equation addresses sensitive questions related to the fields of defence and nuclear capabilities. The fourth section on China and India in a Unipolar World observes the emergence of a triangular relationship between India, China and the United states, while exploring the prospects for the advent of a multipolar world order.]

[Metzger's third seminal book, A Cloud Across the Pacific is an expanded version of the Ch'ien Mu Lecture in History and culture which he gave in 1994 as a series of four lectures sponsored by New Asia College, The Chinese University of Hong Kong. Based on analysis of a wide array of contemporary Chinese and Western political writings, this book sheds light on not only the broad range of Chinese doubts about Western modernity but also the unacceptability of Chinese political theories in Western eyes. Metzger also looks for a critical perspective on this history of mutual criticism. Therefore he reopens the question of whether political theories have a shared agenda and how to describe, evaluate, and rethink them.

Challenging Marxist, Confucian, Postmodernist, and conventionally liberal philosophic approaches, he relies on the empirical description of linguistic practice to show that, historically, political discourses have not just focused on the nature of justice or the good society. Instead they have interrelated four aspects of political life : political goals, the means to reach them, other aspects of the given world, and the nature of knowledge. Because ideas about these four topics have always appeared as culturally inherited premises susceptible to critical debate, improving these ideas is a linguistic possibility which political theories east and west should explore. East and west, however, they have failed to uncover culturally inherited premises and turn them into objects of critical reflexivity, thus perpetuating cultural parochialism and failing to mitigate that clash of civilizations discerned by Samuel P. Huntington. In the U.S., this failure became the intellectual foundation for that ideology of global democratization currently animating U.S. foreign policy. In China, it became the intellectual foundation.]
