[For the most part of the 1960s, KIM Ki-Young was a commercially successful director while adhering to an independent method of production. He made films according to his own production system at his own film company, for a longer period of time than any of his contemporaries. During the 1980s, however, his films did not garner commercial success, and were marginalized as a sort of B-rated films in the Korean film world. He went into a slump, and his films became almost forgotten with the artistic degeneration and industrial stagnation of Korean films.

It was cinephiles of Korea of the late 1980s and early 1990s that "discovered" him and his later works. Emerging with the widespread distribution of videos, these cinephiles went wild with excitement over unfamiliar, strange, and subversive "cult" films; and they placed KIM's films on their list of cult films. His works left a deep impression on a new generation of cinephiles and some of these devotees to KIM have become major figures representing Korean films today.

JIM Ki-young's films were "rediscovered" by foreign filmmakers and critics at the 2nd Pusan International Film Festival (PIFF) in 1997, Encouraged by all this, KIM exerted passionate efforts in producing a new work, but then lost his life due to a fire that broke out in his house. The hope of seeing the new work by KIM Ki-young, the "resurrected old master, "thus vanished away into the void.

This book is coming out nearly a decade after that. As the first book ever on KIM Ki-Young to be written in English, this book will serve as a guide light that focuses more eyes on KIM Ki-young and classical films of Korea.]

This will also be a temporary writing piece in this world, while it waits for IM's next movie.]

It also covers important issues in each sector and explains the effects the structural changes on Korean economic policy and its economy. Finally, the last chapter covers the 1997 financial crisis, subsequent responses by the government and future prospects on the Korean economy.

This book can serve as a textbook for courses such as economic development and East-Asian economies as well as a reference for researchers who are studying the Korean economy. A comprehensive analysis on the Korean economy has been lacking, yet there is a rapidly growing interest in East Asian economies. [Between Two Adversaries: Korean Interpreters at Japanese Alien Enemy Detention Centers during World War II explores a virtually unknown aspect of the Japanese American Internment story. The setting for historian Hyung-ju Ahn's inquiry is not the ten War Relocation Authority-administered detention centers incarcerating the massevicted population of West Coast aliens and citizens of Japanese ancestry. Rather, the venue is a select number of the detention center for "potentially dangerous" enemy aliens run by the Justice Department's Immigration and Naturalization Service. Neither is Between Two Adversaries focused upon internee-administration relationships. It spotlights instead the explosive interethnic conflict that developed between two marginalized Asian groups when the U.S. government enlisted overseas Korean students to interrogate the unjustly demonized Japanese alien victims of American racism. Like the U.S. government, the highly nationalistic Korean students treated the ineligible - for - American-citizenship Japanese aliens as duplicitous agents of imperialist Japan (whose oppressive post-1905 rule over Korea had precipitated a fierce Korean independence movement that sought fulfillment in World War II). The result of such treatment, both for the Korean students and the Japanese enemy aliens, was all too predictable - and quite tragic.]

[This Volume includes a selection of papers originally presented at the Eighth International Conference on the History of Science in East Asia, held in Seoul on 26-31 August 1996. The title, "Current Perspectives in the History of Sciences in East Asia," reflects the wide range of themes and approaches that the collection encompasses. While there is no single overarching theme that unites the contributions, some heartening new trends in East Asian studies of science are evident in the fifty three papers presented here.

The earlier overwhelming imbalance in favour of studies of sciences in China is now being gradually reversed; Papers are included on sciences not only of Japan and Korea, but also of Vietnam and Tibet, as well as on regional sciences in the Chinese

heartlands, Studies of the modern period are no longer treated as a field apart. Many papers in the volume show a clear recognition of important analogies between the study of scientific processes in the modern and pre-modern societies. Nor are the contextual studies limited to the modern period; strictly internalist studies of pre-modern sciences. [The Taehan Empire witnessed the culmination of Korean government efforts at modernizing reforms that had begun after the opening of the ports in 1876, but at the same it also saw the colonization of Korea by Japan. Clarification of the Taehan Empire's modernizing reform projects is important for both understanding the nature of the modern reform movement that began after 1876 and resolving the question of the "nature of colonial society" that has become as issue among scholars in both Korea and the U.S., as well as for illuminating continuities and discontinuities in Korea's modernization process. It is in this context that this book investigates the special contribution of the Taehan Empire period to the larger story of state development in modern Korea.

This book is of scholarly value for some important reasons. First, whereas research in Korea has been limited largely to attempts to clarify the nature of the Taehan Empire through analysis of the civil sector Independence club movement, this book deals with both the nature of governmental reform efforts and with the processes of

modernization in various areas of society. Second, this book will introduce Englishlanguage readers to the controversies that have arisen among Korean scholars over how to understand the process of modernization in Korea while also providing valuable information on the changes Korean society was undergoing at the turn of the twentieth century.]

[Early records of Korean merchant ships can be found in the Wiji Hanjeon (Book of Wei, Chronicles of the Three Kingdoms), an ancient Chinese document. The documents records the people from the state of Mahan traveled by ship and conducted trade, and that the iron produced in the region of Byeonjin was exported to China and Japan. The exact shape and size of the vessels belonging to the ancient people of Korea are unknown. However, a bronze-age petroglyph discovered in Daegok-ri, Eonyangmyeon. located in Ulju-gun in Gyeongsang-do Province displays an image of an ancient Korean ship.

The Construction and shape of Korean ships are not to be found anywhere else. A unique feature of Korean ships is the way the side planks were assemble from bottom to top, with edges that were slightly overlapped and rabbetted for a tight fit. The usage of wooden pegs (pisae) and the props (jangsoe) that keep the sides together and support them against the pressure of the waves is also unique to the hanseon.]

[Induced abortion has been a major topic of fertility research in Korea since the early 1960s. In the beginning of fertility transition, abortion played the most important role in reducing marital fertility. The focus of induced abortion has shifted to the teenagers and young single women as age of women going into marriage rose, as premarital sex became socially more permitted, and as young single women's participation in labour market grew. Induced abortion is more important nowadays as the means of controlling premarital fertility than marital fertility. Also sex selective aborting become prevalent recently in the below-replacement fertility. These developments clearly indicate that a new way of understanding the societal focus and implication of induced abortion is necessary.

Important issues addressed in this study include the reasons for Korean women to seek abortions, frequently repeated abortions, and the health consequences of abortions, particularly when these are performed under illegal, unsafe and unhygienic conditions. Unsafe abortion is found to be the most hazardous variable in the reproductive health of Korean women.]
