The Chief Justice becomes a tool of the executive, and the editor's exposure of this turn of events creates conditions for a motion of impeachment against the Chief Justice. The chief Justice responds by getting several of his lawyer friends to submit three fundamental rights petitions against that motion, and by having an order of prevention passed on the parliamentary by a panel of judges loyal to him so that the motion of impeachment cannot be entertained. This causes a constitutional crisis, and the Chief Justice manages to get the motion of impeachment against him suppressed when the President, who is the friend, dissolves the Parliament. Greater tragedies follow.]
