[This book deals with the relationship between the control of public expenditure of the Government and the nature of political power in the Sri Lankan parliamentary system. It starts with a discussion of the historical antecedents of the form of control of public expenditure and thereafter, it examines the nature and organisation of institutions engaged in the control of public expenditure. This book, more specifically, considers the relationship between Parliament and the Government, and its central concern is to examine the ability of the elected representatives to influence the public decisions of the Government through the various institutions inside Parliament, and their relative roles pertaining to public accountability has been examined. The main question is to what extent the elected members of Parliament of Sri Lanka have power in both the determination of public spending and the guaranteeing of public accountability. It also deals with what members of parliament actually do when they are engaged in the task of controlling public spending. The two main institutions associated in the areas of the control of public expenditure – The auditor General and the Treasury – have been made subject to a detailed analysis. The last two chapters deal with certain comparisons and the relationship of public accountability to the concept of good governance. This work would be an additional contribution to the understanding of how the Sri Lankan parliamentary system works in practice.]

[The first Western Scholars to undertake the study of the ancient literatures of India and Sri Lanka were struck by the discovery therein of story motifs already familiar to them from the Greeks. Attempts to account for the phenomenon at the time were, however, little more than conjecture coloured by prejudice, and based on all too few examples.

In this book Prof. Peris, erudite in the literatures of classical Greece and Rome and widely read in the Jatakas, shows that the number of Greek and Oriental stories with comparable motifs (or fragments thereof) is far greater than had been earlier recognized, while chronology and opportunity argue for their having been swept into India with the Greeks of Alexander and after. Some of these Indo-Greeks, he has reason to believe, converted to Buddhism, which was then flourishing in these same regions, and contributed to Buddhist literature as much as they so evidently did to Buddhist Art.]

To show the motivation and the way of life of these ordained women, the author uses the oldest texts of the Pali Canon. The reader can see clearly the dignity and liberty attained by these venerable ladies through their organisation; their achievements are recognized by contemporary society.

Because of their tenacity and courage, Arahanthood was no more limited to males. Many women attained that highest perfection. The author explains the structure of their organisation, their day to day practices, virtues and mental discipline through which they were trying to attain that sublime goal.
