The reason, the author thinks, is the mythistoric and poetic quality of the sources i.e. the Mahavamsa and allied chronicles of Sri Lanka. Yet nothing like the incredible feats attributed to Dutugemunu's ten great warriors are attributed to Kandula.

[In Sri Lanka, fundamental rights were first expressly declared by the 1972 constitution. The present constitution conferred on the Supreme Court, a special jurisdiction in respect of the infringement of fundamental rights by 'executive or administrative action'.

Although its experience with fundamental rights is relatively short, Sri Lanka is in the process of building up a jurisprudence which has intense relevance and meaning to its people. In doing so, Sri Lanka has drawn on the experiences of other countries, notably India and the United states.

While focusing on the present state of the law in Sri Lanka, the author has sought to identify possible areas for widening the scope of fundamental rights, both by constitutional amendment and judicial activism. Important judgements from several jurisdictions, particularly India, the united states and the European court of human rights have been referred to and an attempt made to discuss rights in a comparative perspective. The book also deals with the political aspects of the various fundamental rights. As such, this work should be of interest not only to the legal community but to students of politics as well.

As an organ of the State, the Supreme court is required by the constitution to respect, secure and advance fundamental rights. The author has emphasized the need for the Court to take on to itself an inquisitorial and activist role in fundamental rights matters, as the Indian Supreme Court has done. The court must not be a neutral umpire as in adversarial litigation but an active guardian of rights, especially because parties are not evenly balanced, the respondent party being the state.]
