'Preah Ko-Style'. Despite its importance, Preah Ko was rarely acknowledged in detail in academic literature. It is the general aim of this publication to analyze Preah Ko in its historical, archaeological, architectural, stylistical and contemporary social and religious questions and to understand the whole complex as a 'historical palimpsest', since its dynamic history was (over-) written several times until today.
