Schools taught Sundanese, and printed materials based on western concepts began to influence indigenous writing and oral tradition.]

[Indigenous Peoples and Migrants of Northern Papua, Indonesia provides a contemporary look at social, cultural, and economic aspects of the lives of these peoples. While political problems associated with Indonesia's western province of Papua (formerly Irian Jaya) have received a great deal of international media attention, studies of the people of the province are rarely available in English. This is especially true in regard to the people of the offshore islands, coast, and hinterland of the northern part of the province from the Bird's Head Peninsula to the border with Papua New Guinea. The region is inhabited by indigenous peoples speaking over 85 languages and by migrants from the islands of Sulawesi, Java, Flores, Lombok, and elsewhere in Indonesia. Many of the chapters in the book focus on economic changes and their impact on People's lives. Chapters examine the effects of transmigration, tourist projects, oil palm plantations, forestry projects, and road construction on local communities. Several chapters examine different types of traditional material culture, such as carving and textiles, and their place in these communities at present. The studies are accompanied by maps, black and white photographs, and plates containing 124 color photographs.]

This is the first book to offer a thorough English-language study on the vicissitudes

of the Dutch and Dutch Eurasians during the Japanese occupation of the East Indies. Dutch historian Louis de Jong's extensive study *Het Koninkrijk der Nederlanden in de Tweede Wereldoorlog* (1969-1988), whose 13 parts were published in 27 volumes and together add up to almost 15,000 pages, is considered to be the standard work on the history of the Kingdom of the Netherlands in the Second World War. The present book, a translation of chapters 5 through 10 of Part 11b – one of the five volumes on the East Indies – makes a section of De Jong's magnum opus available to English readers. It presents an impressive account of the experiences of the Dutch civilians and prisoners of war under the Japanese occupation. An extensive introduction by Jeroen Kemperman sketches the course of events from the arrival of the Dutch in the Indonesian archipelago to the capitulation of the Dutch East Indies in March 1942.]

[For more than two decades the reformist ulama played a significant role in Acehnese society. Over time, the traditional ulama from the pure dayah background were branded as ulama kolot (awkward ulama) and their educational institutions came to be ridiculed. The more flamboyant appearance of the reformist ulama kept the dayah ulama in the shadows. The development of the Acehnese community within the Indonesian context required the reformist ulama to play a major role in politics. The coming of the Japanese to Aceh was also facilitated by the ulama. As a result, the Japanese administration in Aceh gave them a limited role in the bureaucracy, which also provoked jealousy from the uleebalangs. The development of Indonesian politics, and the change of the central government policy towards Aceh, caused a serious problem in regard to the position of the ulama. The dismissal of Daud Beureueh from his position as the military governor for Aceh, Langkat and Karo, and the incorporation of Aceh into North Sumatra, resulted in a rebellion led by the reformist ulama. The ulama felt that they had been betrayed and humiliated. In due time, the traditional ulama will also face the challenges. In order to grasp the complexities of the ever increasing demands of modern society, the traditional ulama are also required to develop themselves in such a way that people are still in need of what they can offer and can benefit from their guidance in many aspects of life. The crucial field is education. Without necessarily shifting the total emphasis of the traditional curriculum, surely some additions can be made. The ulama should think of opening up the existing 'rigid' model of education, particularly the dayah one. Only through the improvement of education can the ulama contribute to the country and the society. The social problems in Aceh, and the participation of the ulama in handling them, strengthen the role of the ulama, not only in the eyes of the rural people, but also in the wider arena. The need of some 'secular' leaders to have some link with the traditional ulama, the spiritual healing they provide, and the increasing numbers of dayah communities, make them even more prominent.]

This rapidly changing world is characterized by the development ‘Philosophy’ of the former New Order and by the growing rural-urban migration of particularly the younger generations. Covering the time-span of the 1940s till the late 1990s this book examines livelihood (including migration) practices, and family and personal life of villagers from different generations and explicitly zooms in on their perceptions and aspirations. To arrive at a better understanding of these perceptions and aspirations and their practice, the generational –cum-ethnographic approach is used as the focal method in the research and in the analysis. With the position of certain groups of villagers, i.e. those involved in rural-urban migration, in new and other spaces the diverging ideals of the generations have become more pressing and more pronounced and they have become crucial to the question of identity formation. The book points out that it is precisely the differences in perceptions and aspirations and, more importantly, the realization of such aspirations and the application of such perceptions, which make a difference. For the realms analysed here, livelihood, and village, family, and personal life, the conclusion has to be that the generations diverge and have managed differently. The key to this conclusion lies very much in the younger generation. By including their voice, a voice hardly heard in village studies, this book adds a new dimension to the field of Java studies.]
