[In this book, the history of the Mountain Province is seen to fall into three distinct periods. In the first of these, when the Republican Party controlled the Presidency of the United states, the emphasis was upon creating a form of mountain reservation for the "non-Christian tribes" of the Cordillera Central. After a series of adventurous expeditions had been undertaken in order to define the ethnology of the region, policy was directed toward developing roads and trails whereby put an end to the intertribal feuding and headhunting, thus laying the foundations for the future civilization of these "wild men", as Dean C. Worcester was in habit of describing these mountain peoples. This policy of creating mountain reservation inevitable lent itself to "divide-and-rule" tactics on the part of the imperial power. The second period was inaugurated by the incoming Democrats in 1913, when the idea of separating the mountain peoples from their lowland Christian neighbors was abandoned in favor of a policy aimed at achieving their integration in the body politic of the Philippine nation, and the emphasis shifted from the building of roads and trails to the provision of better and more widespread health and educational facilities. The third period, hastened by the events of the Second World War, saw the mountain peoples over the local control of their own affairs.]

[Jalandoni believed that love needs freedom for the lovers to be happy and to create what is good and right, not only for themselves, but also for their nation and coutrymen. Thus, it is not merely love between man and women, no matter how pure and complete, that Jalandoni was celebrating. Although they were already blissfully married and wealthy and highly respected by society, Nita and Ely felt that their happiness was not yet complete because their beloved country had not yet been liberated from poverty and oppression from the foreign colonical rulers. This is why the couple joined the Katipunan that was organized by Andres Bonifacio. They donated a great part of their wealth to the Revolution of 1896. In the end, Ely even offered his life in the battlefield for his country's freedom.

The story is told through the panuguiron, a method of narration in Hiligaynon fiction by which a central consciousness that may be supplemented by other narrators tells the story in the first person. The author integrates panuguiron with dreamatized narrativization to structure the architectonics of the novel, there by showing Jalandoni's

The process creates new entities with their own identity out of the qualities and values of the refractors as they reflexively interact. Reflexive refraction as a method of integrating minorities into the national without loss of their identity and individuality is pointed out as a hedge against multiculturalism and postcolonialism. These critical discourses have been realized to aid globalization in the damage it is causing the ethnic, the regional, and other minorities that threaten them with extinction.]

[When Don Quijote de la Mancha was published in 1605, Miguel de Cervantes (1547 – 1616) was about to enter his sixties, an advanced age for the times. He had behind him a life full of hardships and an unsuccessful writing career. Don Quijote changed if not his ill – fated existence, his literary reputation, for the book became an overnight bestseller. Reprints and translations of the novel were published different countries: The first English translation of the novel appeared in 1612; the French version followed in 1614; the German and the Italian ones in 1621 and 1622. As early as 1605 there were copies of the book in Mexico – and most probably some of them must have been shipped into the Philippines not much later. In 1614, an unauthorized sequel to the novel signed by a certain Avellaneda, promoted Cervantes to come out with the second part of Don Quijote in 1615. The masterpiece was thus complete. Cervantes died the following year.

Yet underneath that glory, Don Quijote still retains the miracle of a fresh experience whenever a reader opens its pages. Writers F. Sionil Jose, Alfred Yuson and Vicente Garcis Groyon accepted Instituto Cervantes' Invitation to share their insight on the novel in three lectures held during 2005. Gathered in the present volume, these lectures stand as proof of what wondrous outcome could occur if a Filipino writer reads Don Quijote.]
