Houses that Sugar Built – An Intimate Portrait of Philippine Ancestral Homes’ explores the largely unknown architectural legacy to be found in the ancestral houses of Iloilo, Negros Occidental and Pampanga – the three main sugar-producing provinces of the Philippines. These grand residences have yet to receive international exposure.

Nonetheless, they are important in two ways. Firstly, although easily classifiable in terms of architectural style, upon experiencing the buildings themselves there are almost always layers of additional influence. Secondly, this assured blending of styles reveals what we might call a ‘Critical Ambition’ – a desire on the part of the patrons who commissioned these residences to participate in an international architectural culture. Their relatively overlooked location did not stop the sugar barons responsible for these houses from undertaking a 20th-century form of the Grand Tour of European capitals, returning with a desire to bring the latest trends from Paris or Vienna to the provincial Philippines, or from partaking of the latest streamlined Moderne style from the US.

Beautifully photographed, with over 200 pages of interiors that have rarely been seen by the public, ‘Houses that Sugar Built – An Intimate Portrait of Philippine Ancestral Homes’ is layered with intimate stories and individual house texts that transport us back to a time when these residences were in their heyday

In the large rectangular pictorial Expedición a Jolo 1876, Baltasar Giraudier, reveals his artistic métier in drawing the inhabitants and views of the Sulu Archipelago, the Spanish principals, and fleet during a most crucial historical period. In the past, Giraudier, as a lithographer, worked in tandem with the artist C.W. Andrews whose illustrations of Philippine scenes appeared in *Ilustración Filipina* (1859 – 1860). In *Expedición a Jolo*, Giraudier became the principal artist for all the 38 plates, panoramas, and maps, lithographed by J.M. Mateu in Madrid. These drawings are considered to be among the best lithographic illustrations of the Philippine Islands.

This book is in two parts. The first gives a detailed chronology of Andres Bonifacio's life, focusing on the foundation and growth of the Katipunan (1892-1896); the start of the revolution in the Manila area (August to November 1896); and the months Bonifacio spent with the revolutionists in Cavite (November 1896 to May 1897). The part concludes with a moving account by his widow Gregoria de Jesus, hitherto unpublished in full, of the events that led to his tragic killing.

The second part of the book comprises four essays on the start of the revolution, describing in turn the Katipunan's initial battle plans, as discussed in the weeks prior to the outbreak; the famed "Cry" of August 1896; the initial skirmish with the Guardia Civil on 26 August; and the first major engagement with Spanish forces on 30 August.

This volume looks afresh at historical terrain that is well-trodden yet still passionately contested. Drawing on fresh as well as familiar sources, it seeks to offer a chronicle of events that is as clear, factual and authoritative as the current "state of the field" allows.

Sarangani, not to be confused with a namesake province in mainland Mindanao, is more than just an island group off the Davao Region in the Sulawesi Sea. It almost became the capital of the proto-Philippines. It also witnessed the fulfillment of the objective of the first circumnavigation of the world in reaching the Maluku (in the present-day Indonesia, just south of Mindanao) and the tug-of-war of European control over the region of spices. Because it was a significant island group between Mindanao and the northern Indonesian island clusters, the Sarangani Island Group was frequented by the Europeans and was controlled by the Sangirs or the natives of the Sangihe Island Group in the present-day Indonesia and the Sultanate of Maguindanao based in Cotabato. Although claimed by the Spaniards to be part of the Philippines, it was only colonized in the 1870s. Today, traces of active Philippine-Indonesian ties in the island group continues, while folklores embedded in the silsilas (genealogies) of the culanos (noblemen) reminisce the ancient connection of the Sarangani Islands with the Indonesians of Sangihe.

This book is inspired primarily by the desire to contribute to the work towards Christian Unity in the Philippines. It discusses matters between the Roman Catholic Church in the Philippines (RCCP) and the Iglesia Filipina Independiente (IFI) noting that the IFI separated from the Roman Catholic Church in the beginning of the twentieth century. Having compared the ecclesiologies of RCCP and IFI through Receptive Ecumenism, this work articulates the things that RCCP could learn from the IFI as a ‘Church of the Poor,’ notably in terms of theology, worship, spirituality, and discipline. Moreover, the process of receptive learning by the RCCP has led to the discovery and establishment of greater bonds of unity with the IFI, i.e., a more visible unity and a more profound understanding of the Church as koinonia.
