The author aims to discuss the relationship of temple architecture to sculptures and vice-versa through his dissertation entitled 'Architecture of North Indian Temples (c. 400-1000 AD)' with glossary, bibliography and beautiful illustrations. He has divided the subject matter in seven chapters. Detailed description of sculptures associated with temples was naturally beyond his scope. Dr. Singh seems to be correct in describing the architecture of c. seventh century AD as a link between two styles of temple architecture, which flourished during the times of the Imperial Guptas and the Gurjara-Pratiharas. He has nicely discussed the Pratihara temples region wise, namely those of Central India, Rajasthan and the Himalayan region

The second chapter is devoted to the important stone temples located at different places in Kashmir, Himachal Prades and Uttarakhand. The second volume is devoted to the study of Buddhist Monasteries, Forts & Castles, and Traditional Houses of the Himalayan region. In the first chapter, some of the important Buddhist monasteries of Ladakh, Lahul & Spiti and Kinnaur in the trans-Himalayan region have been dealt in detail. In the second chapter, important forts and castles of the Himalayan region have been discussed. The third chapter is devoted to the traditional houses. This chapter is of great significance, for it is for the first time that the traditional knowledge-system related to the construction of residential houses of the common people has been admitted to the realm of architecture.
