The rapid urban transition new underway in Asia focuses on a limited number of mega-urban regions (MURs) that have reached population sizes in excess of 10 million people. This book examines four of these urban agglomerations - Jakarta, Manila, Bangkok an Ho Chi Minh - in Southeast Asia and two - Shanghai and Taipei - in East Asia. Drawing on unpublished census data for 1990 and 2000, the authors reestimate actual agglomeration sizes and assess social and demographic dynamics across core, inner and outer zones of each MUR. They conclude that these megaurban regions continue to increase their share of national populations, and zones immediately beyond the official metropolitan boundaries are where the most dramatic changes are occurring.
