Professor Tsuneo Yoshikuni (19??-2006), author of African Urban Experiences in Colonial Zimbabwe: A Social History of Harare before 1932, was a serious student of life in the early townships. His research led him inevitably to the story of Mai Elizabeth Musodzi, whose life and work was exemplary at a time when the role of women was often not taken seriously.

Mai Musodzi was born in the Gomba area around 1885. As a child, she experienced the first chimurenga, losing her parents in this struggle, before subsequently receiving a mission education at Chishawasha. Illustrated with a large number of photos, some remarkable survivals, this collection of autobiographical essays tells of Dr Bard's childhood in Eastern Siberia, with a fascinating detour to Moscow and the Crimea while Russia was still in post-revolutionary turmoil. He moved on to Harbin for high school where the musical talent that is a strong thread running through this story began to blossom. As did so many Russian émigrés,he moved to Shanghai in the mid 1930s and spent his last school years there at the 'Eton of China'. Good fortune and his usual determination saw him move again to study medicine

at the University of Hong Kong. Typhoons and epidemics were just precursors of the trauma of Japanese invasion in which the author served as a medical officer in the Volunteers. His just-learnt medical skills were most valuable and much tested in his years as a prisoner-of-war in the Sham Shui Po camp.

After the war and a few years in the UK, he came back to Hong Kong. He founded the medical service at the University, and also created and led orchestras for both Western and Chinese music. While music continued to be an outlet for his remarkable energies, another activity – archaeology – came to the fore, and in these essays he describes both pioneering local digs and his worldwide travels to archaeological sites.

In these two volumes of essays, Feroz Ahmad focuses on a crucial period of Turkish modernization, from Young Turk period to the Republic of Turkey and the relationship between the Committee of Union and Progress and Modern Turkey. He discusses the works of a generation of reformers and engineers of a new social order, as well as events that shaped the path of modernization. These articles deal with the period since the 1908 revolution, examining the process by which the new Turkey was formed. The author also underlines the crises of legitimacy that characterized much of the period.

The essays in two volumes are compiled thematically. The first volume deals with the "ideas" of modernization which span the period of Young Turk Revolution to the Kemalist movement.
