Durable, flexible and abundant in nature, bamboo has been used as a material and a subject in Chinese art for millennia. Because it bends in a storm but does not break, it was particularly associated with the integrity and personal virtue of the scholarly elite, who embraced its symbolic value by planting bamboo in their courtyards, observing it in the wild, and by producing, acquiring and displaying delicate bamboo objects suitable for various scholarly pursuits, such as painting and calligraphy.

During the Ming dynasty (1368–1644), scholarly and imperial patronage transformed bamboo carving into a major art form. Scholar-carvers and workshops centred around Jiading (in present-day Shanghai) and Jinling (now Nanjing) produced large numbers of brush pots, wrist rests, miniature landscapes, figurines and other objects. Many bamboo carvers also worked in other materials soft enough to be manipulated with the 'iron brush'—a term for knives and other carving tools used by literati to transfer their brushwork aesthetic to other media—including boxwood, rhinoceros' horns and ivory, which shared a kind of loose identity under the heading of diaoke ('carving' in modern Chinese). Small in scale yet teeming with life, these works reflect prodigious technical skill and great imaginary involvement because of the unique shapes and contortions of the materials involved.

This launching exhibit of National Artist Cesar Legaspi's birth centenary will be pegged on the artist's public art projects and state commissions including those from the collections of the Cultural Center of the Philippines, the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas, the National Museum of the Philippines, the Development Academy of the Philippines, and the kilometer markers done for the Bataan Death March. With some works no longer being extant such as Legasni's contribution to the With some works no longer being extant such as Legaspi's contribution to the Kulay Anyo ng Lahi mural project this exhibition will solicit the interventions of younger generations of artists to possibly effect a conversation between those who were caught up in the polarities of affinities between creative agents who either chose to distantiate themselves, or were effectively positioned beyond the radar of art spaces activated by the state during martial law.

Traditional Javanese textile art lends itself perfectly to telling stories about the centuries-old culture of the island of Java. Flowers from Universe. Textiles of Java is first of all based on the memories and associations of Alit Djajasoebrata, who grew up in the bosom of her Western Javanese family and as such frequently came into contact with batik in the form of highly prized batikked hipcloths that her female family members used to indirectly convey their personal sentiments to their environment, and distinguished themselves from other women. Alit learned to associate batik patterns and their colours with social occasions and personal moods and was fascinated by the way women talked about them. The associations between textiles, history, mythology and music in Javanese cultures were natural and self-evident.

Later, as a curator of the Rotterdam World Museum in Indonesia – which, due to

its unique history, is rich in textiles from Java – she had the opportunity to investigate and elaborate on these youth impressions scientifically.
