Central to the exhibition is Chua's expanded idea of painting as a medium that occupies 'two-and-a-half dimensions'. In Edge Control, Chua employs a hardedge monochromatic language that links the unique shape and content of each painting. Her print-based works developed at STPI feature graphic effects which generate optically deceptive imagery, such as the moiré pattern. These works combine several printmaking techniques, including screenprinting on acrylic and

relief printing on paper.
"Twofold" is the artist's exploration of fundamental questions of painting, particularly its perception and constituent materials. It arises not only from ideas of human vision and simulation, but experiences of interpretation which unfold

over time.

His story is a commentary on the cultural history of 20th Century Sri Lanka. His contribution to art and the history of art spans the previous century to the birth and development of modern art in the country.

Manjusri's works are found in many galleries, including the Sapumal Foundation and the National Art Gallery in Colombo, Horniman Museum in London, Kunst Historiches Museum in Vienna, New York Public Library, Columbia University Library, Metropolitan Museum in New York and in numerous private collections.

After giving up robes in 1949, he worked as a journalist at Lake House Newspapers until his retirement in 1968. He wrote more than 200 articles pertaining to temple paintings, Asian art and culture. Recognized both in Sri Lanka and internationally, his many accolades include the Ramon Magsasay Award. He died a national hero.

Artists eagerly embraced the new freedoms and, in so doing, captured their nation at a time of considerable fluidity. This book presents paintings by, and concise companion interviews with, eighty artists. Collectively, the paintings from the 2010s and the interviews from 2020 reveal the lived experience of Myanmar's reform years and the aspirations expressed by citizens for the future. They assume an almost elegiac quality in the aftermath of a 2021 military coup that brought the transition to a crashing halt and cast a dark cloud over the society. Placed alongside each other, the eighty paintings and the reflections of the artists who created them offer rare insights into a landmark decade in Myanmar. Together, they conjure a set of nuanced understandings of a pivotal Southeast Asian state navigating complex political change and building dreams that, in the event, were all too suddenly shattered.

STPI presents "Meta physical", an exhibition that chronicles the modes in which

the dialectic relationship between matter and creative intuition is processed through the artist's personal language of abstraction.

Through a rigorous experimentation in print and paper, Martin's practice of abstract painting is reinvigorated by the processual nature of printmaking and the

introduction of new material qualities.
In particular, the possibilities of embossed relief and paper casting have brought to Martin's paintings a distinctive vocabulary of expression through a sustained exploration of line and gesture. The artist's marks take on sweeping, continuous linearities in his drypoint compositions, while works of aquatint record drip-like traces. In his series of paper pulp paintings, textured images further occupy the space between the pictoriality of painting and the spatiality of sculpture. We Are What We Mask is Eko Nugroho's first solo presentation in Singapore. In this instance, the artist furthers his exploration of masks as images, objects and second skins, as well as the notion of "masking" as a form of concealment or disguise. disguise. For Eko, the masked face also symbolises Man's inherent "two-faced-ness" – the ability to change identities, conform and adopt a new persona for protection or as a form of disguise and transformation.

Inspired by Gillian Vogelsang-Eastwood and Willem Vogelsang's "Covering the Moon, An Introduction to Middle Eastern Face Veils" – an illustration on the history of face veils from pre-Islamic origins to the present day – Eko worked in collaboration with the team at STPI and produced over 70 works during his five-week residency. Some of the major highlights in this exhibition include a series of wearable full-faced masks and "face veils", photographic prints and paper pulp paintings with relief and screen prints that depict responses to his Singaporean experience and observations of socio-political conditions in his surroundings. experience and observations of socio-political conditions in his surroundings. Eko Nugroho (b. 1977 – Indonesia) is an internationally-renowned contemporary artist based in Yogyakarta, one of the major art centers in Indonesia. Having graduated at the Art Institute in the same city, his background in street art and community-based artwork is the quintessential aspect of his expanded body of works. From paintings, drawings, and embroideries, to murals, sculpture, or video, his works are deeply anchored in both local traditions and urban environment. His trademark consists of a new visual language where political messages are playfully intertwined with appropriated aesthetics of street art, graffiti, and comics.
