Nevertheless, the challenges to food and nutrition security remain formidable. Future agricultural growth and food and nutrition security are threatened by population growth, worsening soil fertility, diminishing access to land and other scarce natural resources, increasing vulnerability of crop varieties to pests and diseases, and persistent poverty leading to poor access to food. Since independence in 1947, the government of India, the Reserve Bank of India along with NABARD has made concerted efforts to provide the rural poor people with access to credit. Despite the phenomenal rise in the physical outreach of formal credit agencies in the last several decades, the disadvantaged sections of society including poor women continue to depend on informal sources of credit. Regular institutions have faced difficulties in dealing with a large number of small borrowers, whose credit needs are small, but their ability to offer collaterals is limited. Besides, cumbersome procedures and risk perceptions of the banks leave a gap in serving the credit needs of the poor. In the above background, microcredit emerged as the best and practical alternative to the conventional banking in reaching the hitherto unreached poor population. This book assesses the role of LDRB, the only RRB in the study area, in advancing microcredit through NABARD's 'SHG-Bank Linkage Programme' (19920) and the GOI's 'Swarnajayanti Gram Swarozgar Yojana' (1999) in rural empowerment, especially, the empowerment of rural women in India, with special reference to Karbi Anglong District of Assam. Evaluating the performance of Self-Help Groups (SHGs) with a number of case studies, it tries to identify the factors that contribute to their successful performance and their sustainability. It also studies the level of participation of women in SHGs and examines the group dynamics that influence their participation in SHGs. The extent of involvement of the rural poor women in the microfinance institutions has also been analysed in details. Both the aforesaid programmes envisage organization of the rural women into SHGs for building their own capacities to manage the financial issues and then negotiate bank credit on commercial terms. This book deals with the role of RRB, microcredit and SHGs in the empowerment of rural women.

Malaysia was once on the cusp of becoming one of the 'Asian Tigers' as a result of the impressively high growth rates recorded in the early 1990s. From 1990 until 1997, the growth rate was above 9 percent per annum on average. This performance came to an end when the economy was struck by the 1997/98 Asian Financial Crisis, the worst economic crisis Malaysia has ever experienced since independence. Things eventually worsened with the onslaught of the 2008/09 Global Financial Crisis, which dragged the Malaysian economy yet into another round of a recession with the growth rate contracting at 1.5 percent in 2009. On hindsight, these two events, which have had a substantial impact on the state of the Malaysian economy, pointed to several urgent calls for economic reforms, such as the need to address structural weaknesses of the economy and to have a growth target which is both sustainable as well as inclusive. When Datuk Seri Najib Razak became the sixth Prime Minister of Malaysia from April 2009 until May 2018, it was clear that a new approach to economic development for Malaysia had to be crafted. Towards this end, he introduced the National Transformation Policy (NTP), so that the economy can be transformed into one that is of high-income and developed status by the year 2020. He also set a new vision for Malaysia, also known as the 2050 National Transformation, or TN50, which is meant to chart a new course for Malaysia to move into the second half of the 21st century. How successful is this transformational agenda? What are the other issues and challenges which need to be addressed? What important lessons can we learn from this transformational journey? This book is an attempt to address these specific questions by assessing Najib's economic plans, policies, programmes and vision which evolved during the nine years of his term as the sixth Prime Minister of Malaysia.

This is a model that invites emulation and challenges Malawians and Scots to be ambitious as they work together for sustainable development.
